PAYING IT FORWARD

In early 2022, Senator John Cronin proposed an earmark of \$750,000 for the FRA in the State's Economic Development Bill. The earmark was to be used for general economic development activities. Senator Cronin worked diligently to secure this earmark among many others throughout the region, which was later approved by Governor Baker in December. While fighting for the earmark, he worked with executive director Meagen Donoghue to think creatively on how to use the funds toward incentivizing development at 520 Main Street, the former Johnsonia lot, which the FRA acquired in January of 2022.

While sites were set on the redevelopment of the Johnsonia lot, the FRA was also open to other possibilities throughout our Urban Renewal District. With that in mind, Senator Cronin once again reached out looking to see if we could use those funds to help out Fitchburg stakeholders, NewVue Communities & Fitchburg Art Museum, with their artist housing project located at the former B.F. Brown School called the Fitchburg Arts Community.

At the FRA's March Board of Directors meeting, the idea was proposed to use the earmarked funds towards advancing the artist housing project. In the true spirit of collaboration and without hesitation, the Board voted unanimously to transfer the entirety of the earmark to NewVue Communities.

The NewVue project is not only in line with the FRA's Urban Renewal Plan's goals and objectives but is also going to continue the momentum of the positive changes recently seen in the downtown. Because of this, the FRA is honored to help such a catalyst changing project.
