This line has never rung truer than with our friends, the local political delegation of Senator John Cronin and State Representative Michael Kushmerek. From the very start of their first terms, the two legislators have seen the value in redeveloping downtown Fitchburg and have brought thousands of dollars to the community for various reasons through their earmark process. To the FRA's surprise, we were a recipient of not one but two earmarks, equaling \$750,000 each (a total of \$1.5 million).



It is through Senator Cronin's and Representative Kushmerek's commitment to fostering economic growth and community development that these earmarks will undoubtedly play a pivotal role in furthering the FRA's mission to enhance the quality

of life for Fitchburg residents, promote job creation, and attract investments that contribute to the overall prosperity of the region.

The funding secured will be instrumental in advancing various projects that are integral to the FRA's redevelopment plans (see the article 'Tis the Season of Giving). From infrastructure improvements to innovative economic initiatives, these earmarks will empower the FRA to transform Fitchburg into a thriving hub of opportunity and potential. We are deeply appreciative of the legislative team's steadfast support, which serves as a catalyst for positive change in the community.

'TIS THE SEASON OF GIVING

No matter what or who you believe in during the holiday season, many of us feel the joy in giving gifts. May it be a gleaming smile from your gift recipient or knowing you've made someone's day by making it brighter, there is no better feeling. The FRA has been granting money to many causes this year may It be through funding requests from community groups, grant programs, or just providing help in other ways. These gifts have bridged financing for large-scale projects, provided assistance to small business owners when they needed that little something to cover the costs, funded community events and organizations, and provided non-monetary assistance to a few community-minded organizations.

As mentioned in the article "A Little Help from Our Friends," the FRA received two allocations of \$750,000 from the local political delegation of Senator John Cronin and State Representative Michael Kushmerek. The FRA then paid it forward to NuView Communities' Arts Community to help bridge the funding gap to kick off the construction project that has been eleven years in the making. The second \$750,000 allocation will go to the housing project at the former Iver Johnson Mills along River Street. Due to a steep escalation in supplies and construction costs, this money will help close the financial gap the developers face as they embark on this transformative project. The FRA also donated \$50,000 to the Library Capital Campaign because of the long-standing service it provides to young and old alike.



It is not always about the big projects, however. The FRA has also granted developers and small businesses owners the following:

THE NEW DESIGN GRANTS IN ACTION

The Design Grant is a new program to help ease the costs of design drawings often required, but not necessarily planned for by the business owner. Drawings can include, but are not limited to architectural, mechanical, or structural designs for new spaces or upgrades within the FRA's Urban Renewal District. This reimbursement grant awards up to \$2,000 and can be applied to at any time throughout the year.

The Main Street Housing Program is aimed at providing a financial boost for developers whose projects involve residential units on upper floors of commercial buildings along Main Street. The program grants \$5,000 per unit for up to ten units, potentially totaling \$50,000. This reimbursement grant can be applied to at any time but must be completed within the year of the approval date.
